Chief Donald Grady, II

Donald Grady recently returned from working 12 months with the Interior Ministry in Iraq and will be speaking about how interventions involving policing agencies have been falling short across the world. Grady has worked overseas in a number of capacities (1997-2000): Deputy Police Commissioner, UN Mission in Kosovo; Senior Police Advisor, Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe, Vienna; Special Police Advisor, US Department of Justice, Jerusalem; and Regional Police Commander-Brcko, UN Mission in Bosnia and Herzegovina. He is presently serving as Chief of Police at Northern Illinois University, and had previously served as Chief of Police with the Santa Fe Police Department (1994-96), for the University of New Mexico (1991-94), and with the City of Bloomer Police Department (1988-91). Grady holds a Ph.D. Administration and Management from Walden University, and M.S./B.S. Management from Cardinal Stritch College.
